## Jesus' Disciples

### Unit Overview

Lives change and exciting plans unfold as Jesus calls the disciples to follow him. The children will see wholehearted responses to Jesus as they hear the stories of Peter, Andrew, James, John, Matthew and the Twelve. They will consider that God loves each of them and has special plans for their lives. The children will think about what it really means to trust and obey Jesus today.

#### Lesson 1 Peter and Andrew

#### Scripture Memory Verse Mark 1:17 "Come, follow me," Jesus said, "and I will make you fishers of men."

God's plan for Peter and Andrew unfolds as the children hear Jesus' call. They will consider Peter and Andrew's response to follow Jesus as they think of ways that they can follow Jesus in their own lives.

#### Lesson 2 James and John

#### Scripture Memory Verse Proverbs 3:5 Trust in the Lord with all your heart.

Jesus calls James and John, fishermen and brothers, who leave their father in the boat to follow the Lord. The children will consider the hearts of these two men as they think about ways they can wholeheartedly follow Jesus.

#### Lesson 3 Matthew

#### Scripture Memory Verse John 14:15 If you love me, you will obey what I command.

The decision to follow Jesus produces a dramatic and exciting change in Matthew's life. The children watch Matthew transform from a fisher of "money" to a fisher of men. Inspired by Matthew's new mission, the children will make their own plans to tell their friends about Jesus.

#### Lesson 4 The Twelve

#### Scripture Memory Verse Ephesians I:4 For he chose us in him before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in his sight. The unit closes as Jesus calls the Twelve to be with him. The children will consider why it would be special to be called by Jesus and will think of reasons why they want to be chosen by God in their lives.
