Jesus with People

Unit Overview

In this unit, the children will watch Jesus interact with many different people. Each time, Jesus shows his love, power and compassion in an exciting way. The children will see that Jesus is extraordinary. He fed people with food and with faith. He watched people with his eyes and with his heart. He touched the untouchable leper—and had some surprises for the Samaritan woman. The unit concludes with a special missions lesson that will help the children to understand their roles in their churches' world mission.

Lesson 1 Lunch for 5,000

As the children watch Jesus feed the crowd with food and faith, they will consider ways that Jesus can also bless what they give.



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Lesson 2 The Poor Widow

Scripture Memory Verse 2 Corinthians 9:7 God loves a cheerful giver.

Appearances can be deceiving—and they are in this amazing story of one woman's gift. Surrounded by rich people who threw their money into the treasury, a poor widow impresses Jesus by giving all she had to live on in the form of two small coins. The children learn who Jesus considers to be truly rich as they think of how they can do their best for God.

Lesson 3 Touched by Jesus

Scripture Memory Verse Mark I:41 International Children's Version (ICV) Jesus felt sorry for the man. So he touched him and said, "I want to heal you. Be healed!" Once again, Jesus is the master of the unexpected. Not only did Jesus show compassion for a man with leprosy—he touched and healed him! The children will learn that Jesus' love knows no limit as they think of ways that they can help sick people in their lives.

Lesson 4 The Samaritan Woman

Scripture Memory Verse Hebrews 13:16 Do not forget to do good and to share with others.
