Jesus Gives Life

Unit Overview

In this unit, the children take an unforgettable journey with Jesus to the cross and to the resurrection. Beginning with Jesus' anointing and triumphal entry, the children will see God's careful planning and preparation for this history-changing event. Not only will they see how people praised and honored Jesus, but the children will themselves think of ways to show their appreciation to God for Jesus. During this season of new life, the children will begin to develop their own understanding of how Jesus gives life.

Unit Goals

- The children will learn the events surrounding Jesus' death, burial and resurrection.
- The children will understand that God raised Jesus from the dead.
- The children will learn ways to express thanks and praise to God.

Unit Contents

Lesson 1 Anointed at Bethany Scripture Memory Verse 1 Corinthians 15:57 But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

The children begin their journey to the cross with Jesus being anointed at Bethany. They will watch Mary's humble outpouring of love and appreciation as they think of ways they can show their own appreciation for Jesus.



Lesson 2 Triumphal Entry

Scripture Memory Verse Psalm 100:1-2 Shout for joy to the LORD, all the earth. Worship the LORD with gladness; come before him with joyful songs.

The children will witness Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. As the people sang praises to God, Jesus began his journey to Calvary. The children will think about the importance of praising God and will describe ways that they can praise Jesus.

Lesson 3 Crucifixion

Scripture Memory Verse John 3:16 For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.

Like never before, the children will see Jesus as the perfect Son of God. Faced with betrayal, denial, insult and rejection, Jesus went silently and resolutely to the cross—to give us a way to God. The children will consider the perfect responses of Jesus to the imperfect people who betrayed him.

Lesson 4 Resurrection

Scripture Memory Verse Matthew 28:6 He is not here; he has risen, just as he said.

Through Mary's memories, the children will learn the breathtaking story of the resurrection. They will use their imaginations as they run back with Peter and John to see for themselves the empty tomb. As they consider the awesome power of God to raise Jesus from the dead, the children will think of ways that God's power can help them.
