# Adventures of Moses

## Unit Overview

In this unit, the children will watch Moses' adventures unfold through the pages of the Bible. From a helpless baby in a basket to God's mighty instrument, Moses is transformed by God into a man of remarkable and inspiring faith. God unveiled his plan for Moses to powerfully rescue Israel from slavery in Egypt. Later, Israel made a choice to not trust God—and they spent the rest of their years in the wilderness. The children will see the heart of God for his people, learn the power of obedience and think of ways that they can make God happy by their faith.

- The children will learn about the amazing life and leadership of Moses.
- The children will understand that God had a plan for Moses' life.
- The children will believe that God has a plan for their lives.

## Unit Contents

#### Lesson | Early Years

Scripture Memory Verse Romans 8:28 And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him.

Moses starts crying out to God as a baby in a basket. The children will see that God had amazing plans for Moses' life. The children will also think of ways that God watches over them.

#### Lesson 2 The Call of Moses

Scripture Memory Verse Exodus 3:12
And God said, "I will be with you."

Although raised in Egyptian wealth, Moses sees the slavery of his people. Unsuccessful at his first attempts to help his people, Moses is later called by God to rescue and deliver his people. The children will see how God helped Moses to grow in his faith and leadership as they think of ways that God can use them today.

#### Lesson 3 Plagues and Passover

Scripture Memory Verse Deuteronomy 6:3 Be careful to obey so that it may go well with you.

God reveals his passion for his people as he brings Pharaoh and all of Egypt to their knees. Moses and the Israelites escape with Egypt's plunder and God's mighty power. The children will watch how God led and protected his people as they think of ways God helps and protects them.

#### Lesson 4 Exodus

Scripture Memory Verse Exodus 14:22 And the Israelites went through the sea on dry ground, with a wall of water on their right and on their left.

Out of Egypt, the Israelites continue to be powerfully and lovingly led by God. The children will stand at the mouth of the Red Sea and watch as God uses Moses to divide the waters and lead his people through. Not only will the children see Moses' incredible faith in God, but they will also see that God is still doing amazing things for his people today!

#### Lesson 5 Ten Commandments

Scripture Memory Verse Exodus 20:20 The fear of God will be with you to keep you from sinning.

The children will go to the mountaintop to hear how God gave the Ten Commandments to Moses. They will see God's awesome power and will learn the importance of obeying God's laws today.

#### Lesson 6 Wilderness Years

Scripture Memory Verse Deuteronomy 1:21 See, the LORD your God has given you the land....Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged.

After all that God had done to rescue and deliver his people, they still refused to believe that God could take them into the land he promised. Joshua and Caleb are blessed for their faith and the children will think of ways that they can make God happy by showing their faith in him.
