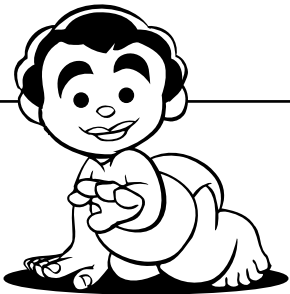
Families

Unit Overview

In this unit, the children will learn that God made families. They will study the first family God ever created: Adam, Eve, Cain and Abel. They will also learn about the different roles and relationships that exist within families, such as fathers, mothers, brothers and sisters. The children will see that God gave them families to help protect them and keep them safe. They will also learn that they have important roles in their families as helpers.

- The children will learn that God created families.
- The children will thank God for creating families.

Lesson 1 My Parents Love Me

In this lesson, the children will learn about the birth of Cain, the first baby ever born. They will also learn about the parent/child relationship in God's first family, as well as in their own families. God's heart to protect children through parents is emphasized, along with God's desire for children to be obedient.

Lesson 2 I Will Obey

God's desire for children to be obedient will be studied further in this lesson. The children will review Adam, Eve and Cain's roles within their families. Additionally, the children will learn to express thankfulness for their families.

Lesson 3 Brothers and Sisters

In this lesson, the children will learn about the birth of Abel, the second child of Adam and Eve. They will also learn about the roles of brothers and sisters in a family. God's heart to protect children through older brothers and sisters is emphasized.

Lesson 4 Review

The children will identify the members of God's first family: Adam, Eve, Cain and Abel. They will review their roles and relationships within the family. They will also identify the members of their own families and explore their own roles in their families, as helpers or as older brothers or sisters.
