Worshipping God

Unit Overview

There are many ways to worship God; singing, playing music and dancing are just a few. The children will get to practice worshipping and praising God in these varied ways throughout this unit. They will learn how David worshipped God, how the early disciples worshipped God and how disciples worship God today.

Unit Goals

- The children will learn to worship God in song, music and dance.
- The children will learn that they can worship God alone and with others.
- The children will understand that the church is made up of disciples who love and worship God.

Lesson 1 David Sings to God

The children will learn that David had his own relationship with God in which he sang and danced. This lesson will teach the children that God is happy when we are intimate with him. The children will practice singing and dancing to God.

Lesson 2 | Sing to God

The children will learn that David sang to God because he loved him. They will learn that it makes God happy when we play music to him. The children will make their own music using instruments.

Lesson 3 We Go to Church

The children will discover that disciples today are the same as the disciples in the Bible. They will learn that God wants us to be just like the first-century disciples by imitating Jesus. The children will sing and pray together just as the early disciples did.


Lesson 4 I Sing and Pray
